

Intermediate Apprenticeship in Health and Social Care (England)

To achieve the Intermediate Apprenticeship in Health and Social Care, learners must achieve the following components.

Learners working in Adult Social Care:

Competence	Level 2 Diploma in Health and Social Care
Knowledge (Technical Certificate)	Level 2 Certificate in Preparing to Work in Adult Social Care
Generic Skills	Key Skills: A minimum of Level 1 Application of Number, Level 1 Communication OR Functional Skills: A minimum of Level 1 Mathematics, Level 1 English
Employee Rights and Responsibilities	Level 2 Award in Employment Responsibilities and Rights for the Health, Social Care and Children and Young People's Settings
Personal Learning and Thinking Skills	PLTS have been mapped to the level 2 Diploma and will be evidenced through mapping. The mapping document is available from the Skills for Care website http://www.skillsforcare.org.uk

Learners working in the Health Sector:

Competence and Knowledge (combined)	Level 2 Diploma in Health and Social Care
Generic Skills	Key Skills: A minimum of Level 1 Application of Number, Level 1 Communication OR Functional Skills: A minimum of Level 1 Mathematics, Level 1 English
Employee Rights and Responsibilities and Personal Learning and Thinking Skills	Level 2 Award in Employment Responsibilities and Rights for the Health, Social Care and Children and Young People's Settings

EDI offers Centres the option to select an Apprenticeship product **with** Technical Certificate or **without** Technical Certificate. All learners taking the Adult Social Care pathway in the Apprenticeship in Health and Social Care must complete a Technical Certificate, however the EDI package without the Technical Certificate is aimed at learners who have already gained this qualification or are making other arrangements.

The EDI Apprenticeship package combines the separate component qualifications. Learners must be registered with and certificated for the overall Apprenticeship by SfCD. EDI certificates the component qualifications which make up the Apprenticeship.

The packs for the individual qualifications provide the content and assessment information required for delivery.
